



**STANDARDISED PRICE LIST**

All funeral directors are legally required to publish this Price List for a standardised set of products and services. This is to help you think through your options and make choices, and let you compare prices between different funeral directors (because prices can vary)

<p><b>ATTENDED FUNERAL (funeral director's charges only)</b>          This is a funeral where family and friends have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person at the same time as they attend their burial or cremation          Taking care of all necessary legal and administrative arrangements          Collecting and transporting the deceased person from place of death (normally within 10 miles of the funeral directors premises) into the funeral directors care          Care of the deceased person before the funeral in appropriate facilities. In addition, the cemetery may charge a number of other fees. Examples include:          Additional mileage (price per mile)          Additional transfers of the deceased person's body (e.g.) to their home, to a place of worship etc.) (price per transfer)          Collection and delivery of ashes          Embalming          Funeral officiant (e.g. Celebrant, minister of religion etc.)          Services out of normal office hours          The funeral director can give you a full list of what they can supply. <sup>1</sup>This fee (which is sometimes called the interment fee) is the charge made for digging and closing a new grave, or for reopening and closing an existing grave.  
<sup>2</sup> In England, Wales and Northern Ireland, you will usually need to pay doctors' fees as well. This is the charge for two doctors to sign the Medical Certificates for Cremation.
